The Plymouth Proprietary Library: A New Beginning

The PPL moved into new premises in 2018. A former church hall had more recently been a doctor's surgery before becoming an independent library. No sooner had the library got settled in this new environment when the COVID outbreak began, and lockdowns ensued.

I started working at the PPL in March 2022 as things began to return to normal. There was an opportunity therefore to start planning ahead. In the light of this recent move, the PPL needed (and still needs) to ensure the local community and beyond know who we are and what we do. There is also the continual financial drive to recruit members to this subscription library by providing a series of talks and events to attract new and existing users. This paper will explore my first year as Library Manager at the PPL and examine the positive steps that are being taken to ensure the library has a future.
